

Why We Share Information About Hunting

Yolo Basin Foundation's mission is to connect people with the wetlands and wildlife of the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area. To do that, we provide information that helps visitors safely and confidently enjoy the area.

The Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area is managed by the **California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW)**, a state entity which oversees habitat restoration, wildlife management, and public use. Hunting is one of the activities that CDFW facilitates here, and the revenue from hunting permits helps support the ongoing management of the Wildlife Area.

We share hunting information because:

- **Visitor Awareness** – Knowing when and where hunting occurs helps all visitors plan their trips accordingly.
- **Public Access Updates** – On hunting days, some parts of the Wildlife Area may be closed to general public access. Sharing this information ensures visitors understand which areas are open.
- **Transparency & Communication** – Our role is to keep the community informed about all activities that may affect their experience in the Wildlife Area.

By sharing information about public use and access to the wildlife area, we hope to help everyone make the most of their visits to this extraordinary place.
